




LYSEO COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL 2015

 - Inclusive special education






EDUCATION SYSTEM IN FINLAND





CHARACTERISTICS OF BASIC **EDUCATION IN FINLAND**

- free (teaching, text books and teaching) materials, school transport and school meals)
- same nine-year comprehensive curriculum for the whole age group teaching is provided by schools near the
- home
- provides the necessary prerequisites for all upper secondary education
- almost all children in Finland complete comprehensive school - dropping out of school and repeating years are rare
- basic education includes a one-year long voluntary pre-primary education in a school or day-care centre
- local authorities can provide voluntary morning and afternoon activities for pupils in basic education

TEACHERS IN FINNISH SCHOOL SYSTEM

- Teacher education:
 - University degree (master degree) in every levels of school system
- Teachers' active agency in school development
 - teaching arrengements, materials, curriculum making, evaluation
 - coherence making in teacher communities





DIFFERENCES IN FINNISH SYSTEM NOTICED BY OUR FOREIGN VISITORS

- No compulsory national exams, no school ranking, no teacher ranking
- School starts at age of seven
- Short school days (30 lessons per week)
- School culture
 - culture between principal and teachersculture between teachers and pupils

 - culture between principal and pupils
- Pupils role

 - a lot of independence and responsebility given in early years
 feeling of positive (natural) respect (adults -> pupil and pupil -> adults)





PART TIME SPECIAL EDUCATION

- Children with learning difficulties in learning and adaptability can receive special support within the mainstream system by a part-time special teacher.
- It may be organised individually, in small groups or in general education as team teaching (special teacher and pupils'class teacher or subject teacher together)
- Two teachers (special)





KEY ELEMENTS OF OUR SPECIAL CLASSES

- Pupil are taken to our special education classes from Noljakka area. This is the area from where pupils normally comes to our school.
- Teachers and assistant teachers are well-experienced and have knowledge about special educational classes and normal classes.
- The plan of pupil's personal teaching arrangements and tasks is made to every pupil. Tasks are focused to the goals of behaviour and self control if needed. Mostly we try to teach as much as possible through mainstream curriculum.
- Cognitive tasks and requirements are not similar to normal classes.
- Co-operation and collabaoration with normal classes are natural and daily.
